INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To Crystal Greer, City Clerk, City of Mississauga,

I have audited the Financial Statement of Amadeus Blazys, candidate for the office of Councillor, which comprises the Summary of Campaign Income and Expenses, the Statement of Campaign Period Income and Expenses, the Statement of Assets and Liabilities as at December 31, 2014, the Statement of Determination of Surplus or Deficit and Disposition of Surplus, and the attached Schedules of Contributions, Fund-Raising Function, Inventory of Campaign Goods and Materials (from Previous Campaign), and Inventory of Campaign Goods and Materials at The End of Campaign for the campaign period from June 11, 2014 to December 31, 2014 relating to the election held on October 27, 2014. This financial information has been prepared by the candidate, in accordance with the accounting requirements of sections 66 through 68, and section 79 of the *Municipal Elections Act, 1996*.

The Candidate's Responsibility for the Financial Statement

The candidate is responsible for the preparation of the Financial Statement in accordance with the provisions of sections 66 through 68, and section 79 of the *Municipal Elections Act, 1996* and for such control as he determines is necessary to enable the preparation of the financial statement free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's Responsibility

My responsibility is to express an opinion on the Financial Statement based on my audit. I conducted my audit in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards. Generally accepted auditing standards require that I comply with ethical requirements, and plan and perform an audit to obtain reasonable assurance whether the Financial Statement is free of material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the Financial Statement. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the Financial Statement, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the entity's preparation of the Financial Statement in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal controls. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the Financial Statement.

I believe that the audit evidence I have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for my qualified audit opinion.

Basis for Qualified Opinion

Due to the inherent nature of the transactions of electoral campaigns, the completeness of contributions and other revenue and expenses is not susceptible to satisfactory audit verification. Accordingly, my verification of these amounts was limited to the amounts recorded in the campaign's accounting records and I was not able to determine whether any adjustments might be necessary to contributions and other revenue, expenses, assets and liabilities.

Qualified Opinion

In my opinion, except for the possible effects of the matter described in the Basis for Qualified Opinion paragraph, the Financial Statement of Amadeus Blazys for the campaign period from June 11, 2014 to December 31, 2014 is prepared, in all material respects, in accordance with the accounting requirements of the Municipal Elections Act, 1996.

Basis of Accounting

Without modifying my opinion, I draw attention to the basis of accounting of the Financial Statement, which is that presented in Form 4 as prescribed under the *Municipal Elections Act, 1996*. As a result, the Financial Statement may not be suitable for another purpose.
