



## INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT

### Report on the Financial Statement

We have audited the Statement of Campaign Income and Expenses and the Calculation of Deficit of Ghada Melek, candidate for Ward 6 for the campaign period from May 22, 2014 to December 31, 2014 relating to the election held on October 27, 2014, in accordance with the financial reporting provision in the Municipal Elections Act, 1996.

### Candidate's Responsibility for the Financial Statement

The candidate is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statement in accordance with the accounting procedures established by the Municipal Elections Act, 1996, and for such internal control as the candidate determines is necessary to enable the preparation of the financial statement that is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

### Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on the financial statement based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards. Those standards require that we comply with ethical requirements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statement is free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statement. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statement, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the entity's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statement in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statement.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our qualified audit opinion.


### Basis for Qualified Opinion

Due to the nature of the types of transactions inherent in an election campaign, it is impracticable through auditing procedures to determine that the accounting records include all donations of goods and services, and receipts and disbursements. Accordingly our verification of these transactions was limited to ensuring that the financial statement reflects the amounts recorded in the accounting records of Ghada Melek, candidate in accordance with the accounting procedures established by the Municipal Elections Act, 1996 and we were not able to determine whether any adjustments might be necessary to income and expenses, and deficit.

### Qualified Opinion

In our opinion, except for the effect of adjustments, if any, which might have determined to be necessary had we been able to satisfy ourselves as to the completeness of the records as described in the preceding paragraph, the financial statement presents fairly, in all material respects, the income and expenses for the campaign from the period May 22, 2014 to December 31, 2014 and the determination of deficit in accordance with the accounting treatment prescribed by the Municipal Elections Act, 1996.
