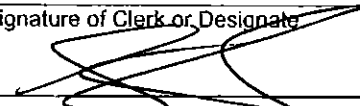

Independent Auditor's Report

To the Office of the City Clerk, City of Mississauga

Report on the Financial Statements

Qualified Opinion

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of Mr. Andrew Gassmann, Candidate - Ward 7, City of Mississauga ("the Candidate"), which comprise the statement of surplus or deficit as at June 30, 2019 and the statement of campaign income and expenses for the 2018 municipal election campaign period then ended.

In our opinion, except for the effects of the matter described in the Basis for Qualified Opinion paragraph, the financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the Candidate as at June 30, 2019, and his financial performance for the 2018 municipal election campaign period then ended in accordance with Section 88 of the *Municipal Elections Act, 1996*.

Basis for Qualified Opinion

In common with many election campaigns, the campaign derived its revenue from cash donations and contributed goods, the completeness of which is not susceptible to satisfactory audit verification. Accordingly, our verification of these revenues was limited to the amounts recorded in the records of the campaign. We were not able to determine whether any adjustments might be necessary to campaign contributions, campaign surplus, or the inventory used from a prior campaign.

We conducted our audit in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards ("CAS"). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the *Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements* section of our report. We are independent of the campaign in accordance with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the financial statements in Canada, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

Emphasis of Matter

The financial statements are prepared to assist the Candidate in complying with the financial reporting provisions of Section 88 of the *Municipal Elections Act, 1996*. As a result, the financial statements may not be suitable for another purpose. Our report is intended solely for the Candidate and the Office of the City Clerk, City of Mississauga and should not be distributed to or used by parties other than the Candidate or the Office of the City Clerk, City of Mississauga. Our opinion is not modified in respect of this matter.

Responsibilities of the Candidate for the Financial Statements

The Candidate is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with *Section 88 of the Municipal Elections Act, 1996*, and for such internal control as the Candidate determines is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's Responsibility for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with CAS. Those standards require that we comply with ethical requirements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement.

As part of an audit in accordance with CAS, we exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit. We also:

1. Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks, and obtain audit evidence that is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control.
2. Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the the Candidate's internal control.
3. Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates and related disclosures made by the Candidate.
4. Evaluate the overall presentation, structure and content of the financial statements, including the disclosures, and whether the financial statements represent the underlying transactions and events in a manner that achieves fair presentation.

We communicate with the Candidate regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that we identify during our audit.
